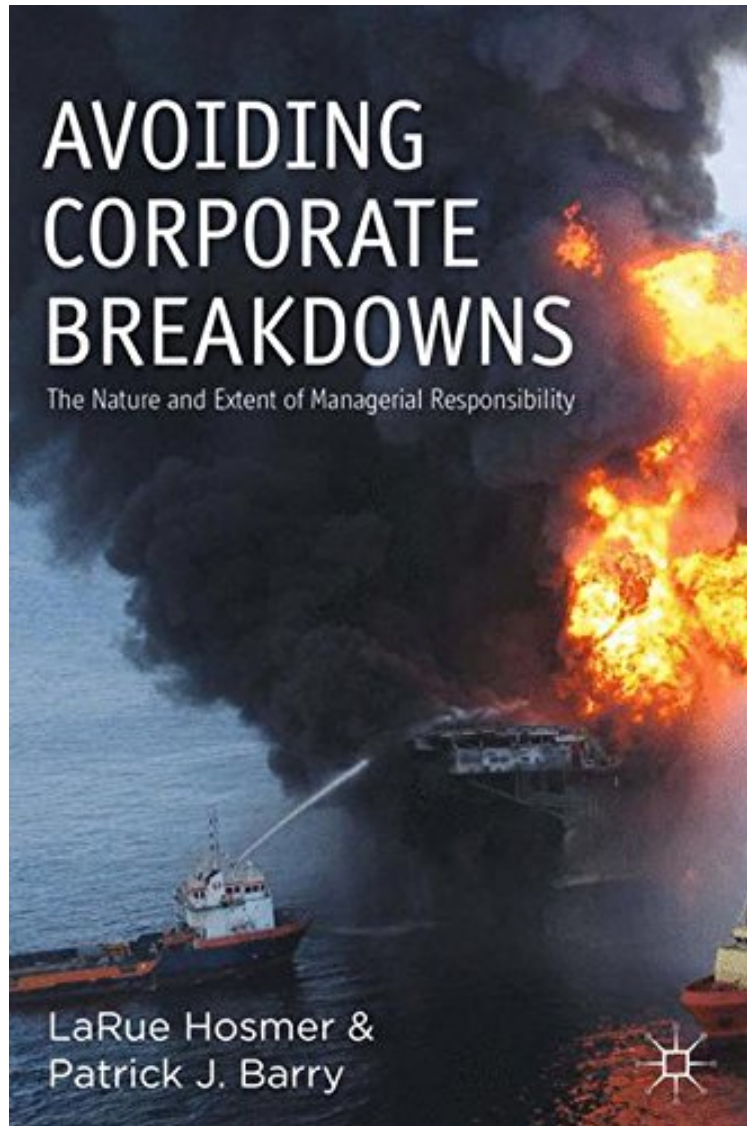


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Avoiding Corporate Breakdowns: The Nature and Extent of Managerial Responsibility
