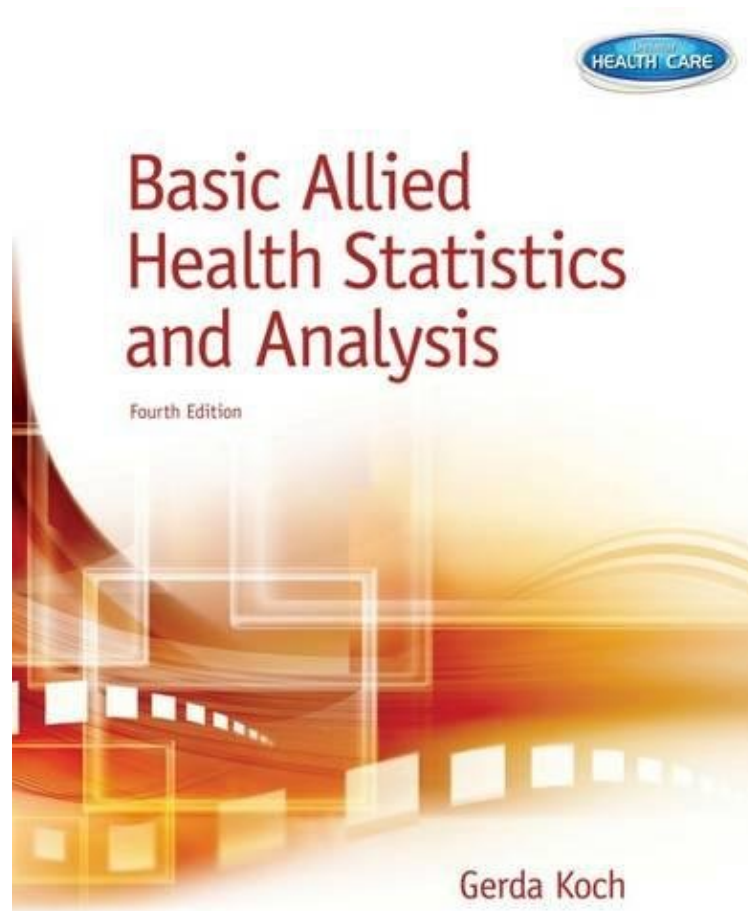

I have only gotten through the second chapter, but I am appalled by all of the mistakes. Chapter 1 was not too bad, only a few mistakes in the self-test and chapter test answers. Chapter 2 had extensive mistakes throughout the answers for the self tests and chapter tests. In addition, some of the questions were badly worded. It was exhausting trying to figure out the questions and answers. There was an instance in the reading when "multiple" was used when it should have been "divisor", and there were other areas where sentences did not make sense. If the rest of the book is as bad as chapter 2, it's going to be a long semester.
