Where It All Began - But Due Diligence Required By Deja ReVu Without Dr. Sutherland, there wouldn't be any CranioSacral Therapy, Integrative Manual Therapy, Strain Counter Strain or Biodynamic Cranial Therapy, as well as Cranial Osteopathy. When Dr. Sutherland published The Cranial Bowl in 1939, he was already 66, and the first textbook of cranial osteopathy details the bones, sutures and expected movements occurring in the cranium. Contributions of Thought has Dr. Sutherland's ideas developing over the last 14 years of his life, taking the biodynamic cranial work in the directions subsequently explored by Dr. Rollin Becker, Dr. James Jealous, Franklyn Sills, Michael Shea, Hugh Milne, Charles Ridley et al.
