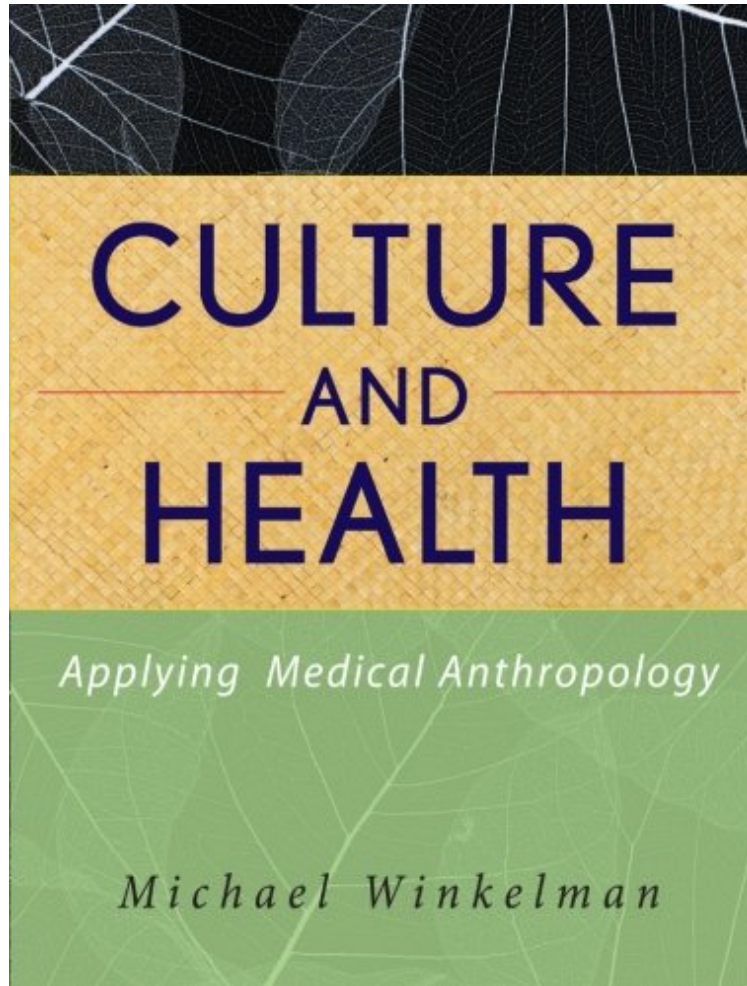

I had bought this digital version for a class I am taking and noticed that there is no way to see the actual page numbers, only the page numbers. This has made it impossible to do certain homework assignments, as such assignment would say things like "review what was said on page 15" something I was not able to do. I eventually had to rent a physical copy of the textbook so that I could have the real page numbers. does allow publishers to include the hardcover textbook page numbers so the reason for its exclusion is beyond me. This is not a review for the book's content or writing, only for the lack of page numbers and the difficulty that it caused.
