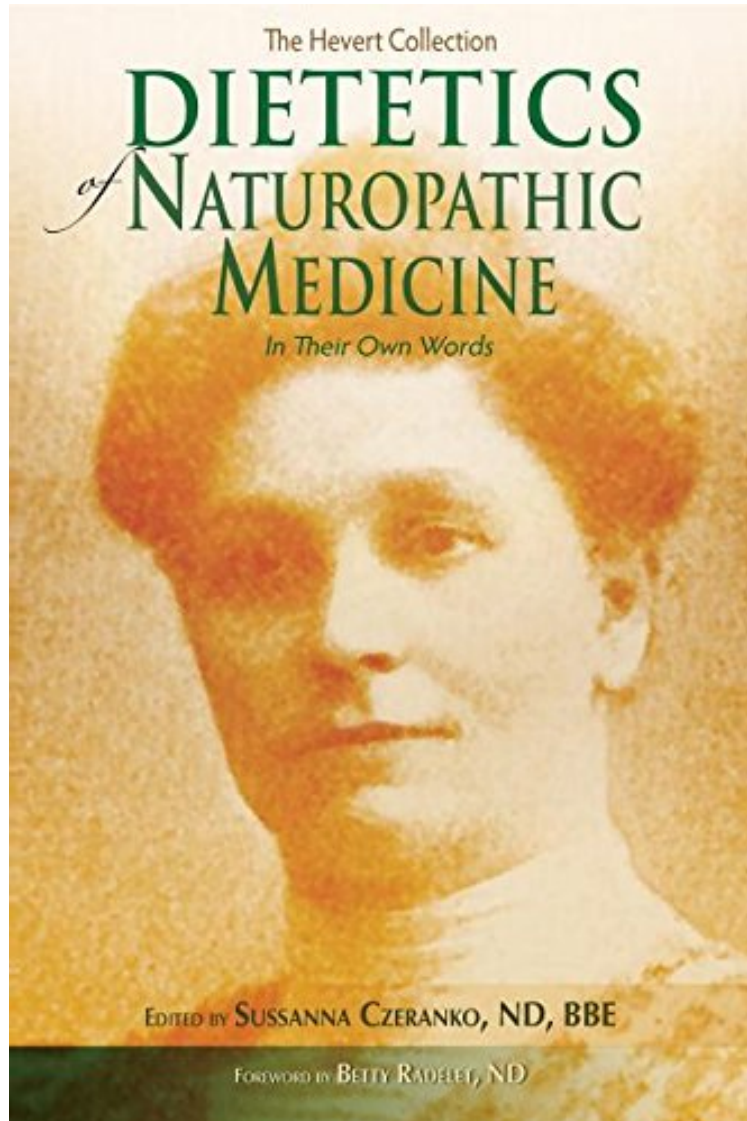


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What we choose to eat is arguably the most important factor in producing and sustaining health. Many families today
