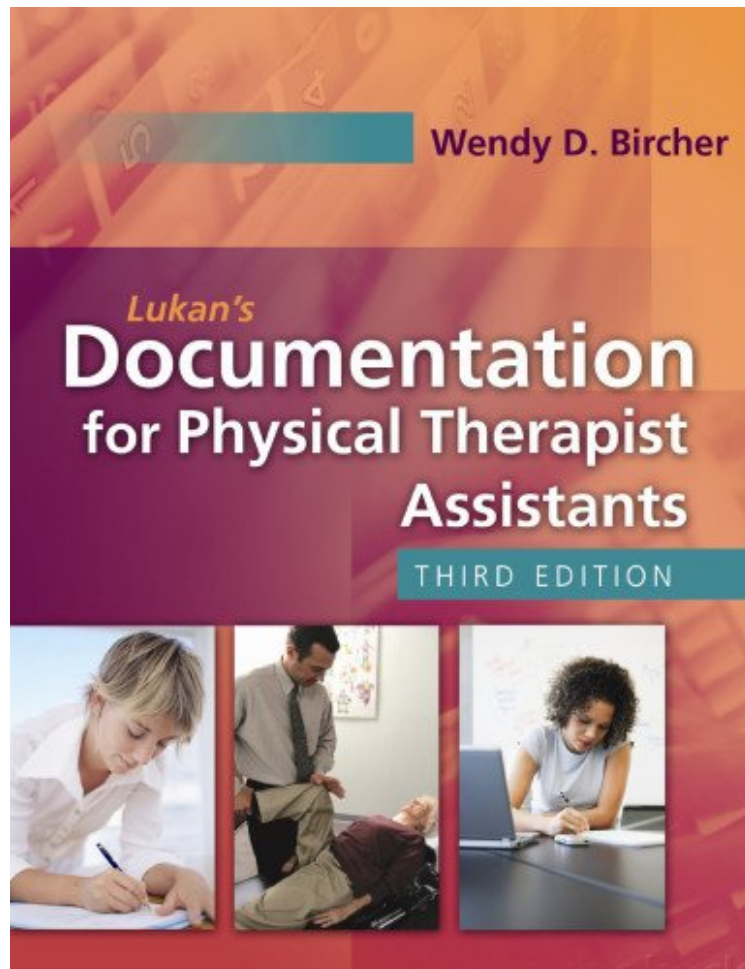

Overall, the information in the book was good. It effectively teaches you how to write a SOAP note, and the abbreviation listing in the back is very helpful. Big, BIG, B-I-G shortcoming for this book however, is the complete lack of an answer key. I realize everyone's SOAP notes are going to look different, however, the early exercises have you sorting given statements into "S," "O," etc. or "pathology," "functional limitation," etc. They could have included an answer key for that. For the actual SOAP note writing, SOME kind of answer key would have been helpful to see if you were at least in the ballpark (e.g., did you forget to include something, or place a fact under the wrong heading, and so forth.) 0 of 0 people found the
