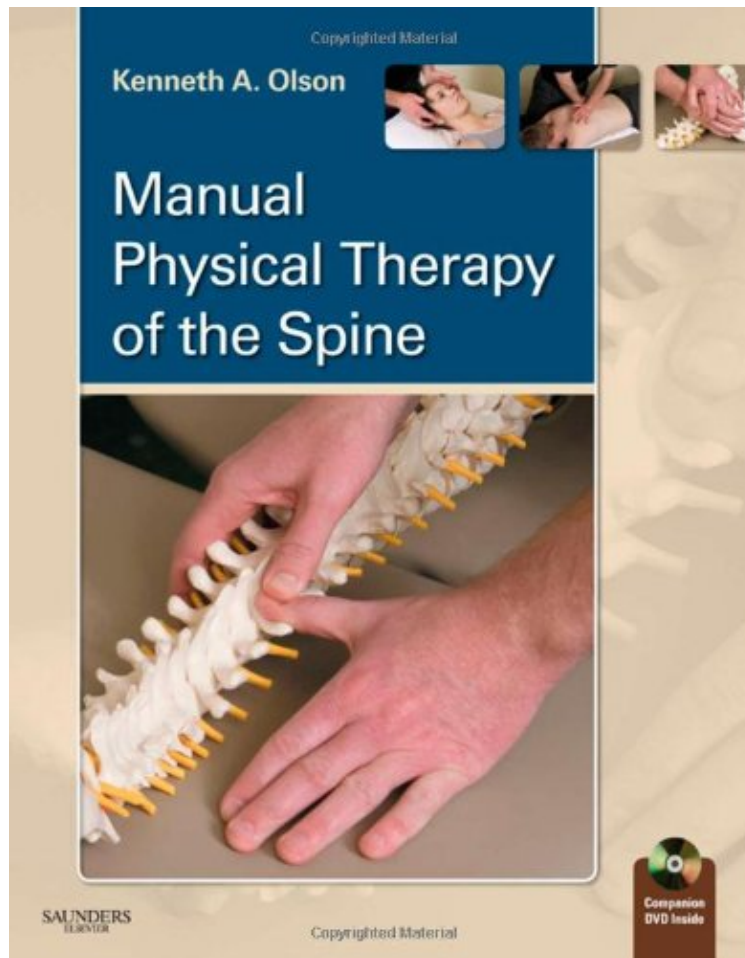


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## Manual Physical Therapy of the Spine, 1e

He uses recent (at least as recent as possible given publication date) research to teach the best practices for exam and intervention, then goes through each exam and intervention technique in detail. Not all techniques in the book are in the DVD so it is a little difficult to mentally picture some mobilization techniques.
