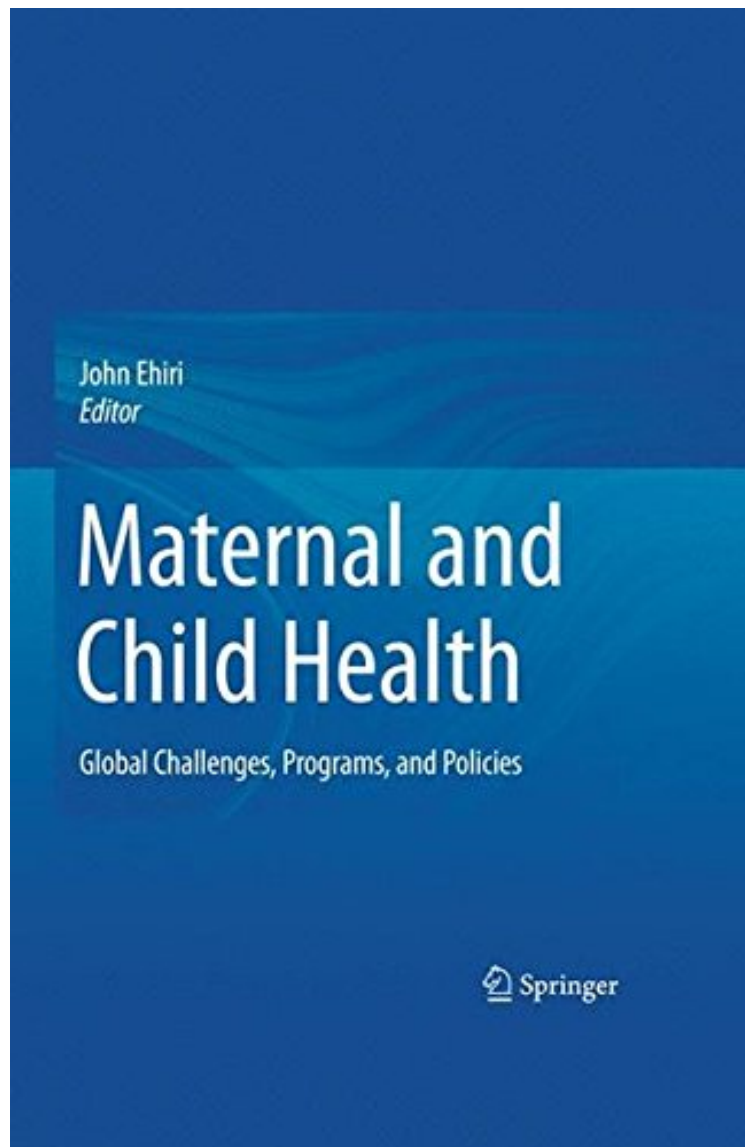

Considering that this book takes on all of maternal and child health from a global perspective, it is relatively concise and thorough. Everything is considered, from large scale policies to the impact of specific diseases to environmental factors. It is fairly well organized, with each chapter opening by stating goals and wrapping up with questions to check for comprehension of the main points. In some chapters, a truly dizzying array of information is presented; for example, one chapter lists the top five causes of death for all age groups of children in all regions of the world. It's a lot of information to cover, and reading a chapter may be overwhelming at times. The graphics are mostly in black and white, although a few are in color, and sometimes they are low-quality images (though still readable). If you are expecting an interesting treatise on maternal and child health for your own personal enjoyment, this is not the place to look for it. This book is meant to impart the important facts, theories, and interventions to people entering the field to help them orient themselves and gain context perspective. On the other hand, if you are a young professional or student interested in figuring out the important factors in current MCH, this is a great resource to start with. The very thorough bibliographies also provide a good place to start looking for more in-depth reading.

The Division of Health Promotion Sciences has a vibrant program of study in domestic and global maternal and child health, in addition to a unique new undergraduate program in public health. Dr. Ehiri's research and teaching focus on social and behavioral aspects of disease prevention, and on global maternal, child and adolescent health - all linked by program intervention design, evaluation methodology and evidence-based policy/practice. He has over 20 years of research, teaching and service experience in global health. Prior to joining the University of Arizona College of Public Health, Dr. Ehiri was Associate Professor in the Department of Maternal and Child Health, School of Public Health, University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB).
