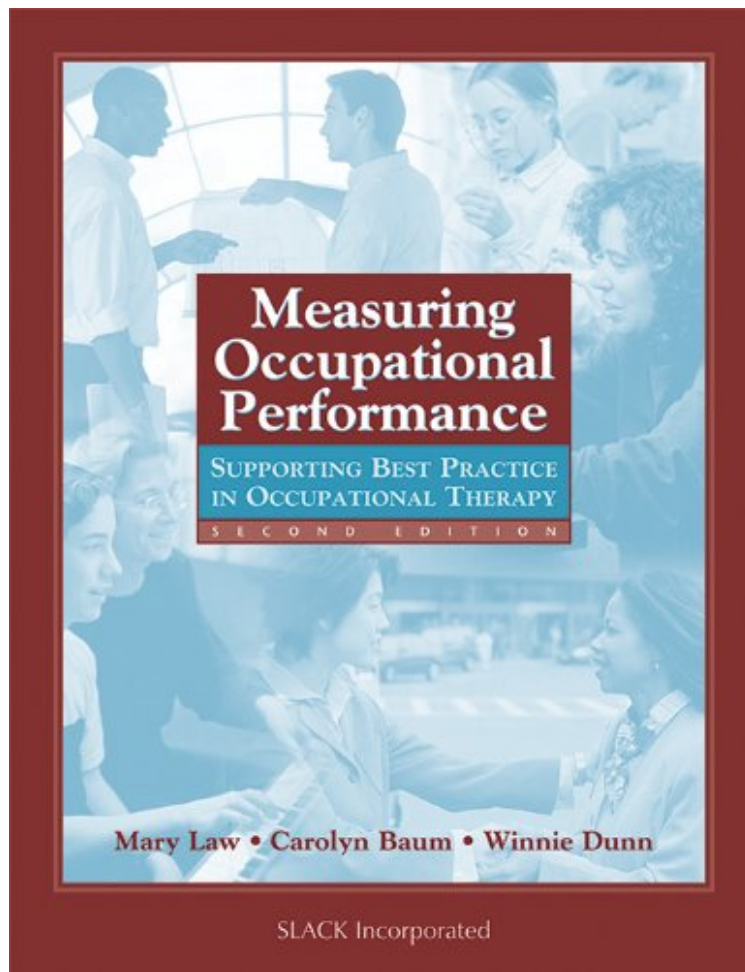


Measuring Occupational Performance: Supporting Best Practice in Occupational Therapy
